### 2013 RESPECT LIFE CREATIVE WRITING CONTEST—

Eighth grade students from the archdiocesan, parish and private elementary schools, parish schools of religion and home school programs are eligible to submit an entry in the annual Creative Writing Contest.

The Respect Life Apostolate will select finalist(s) from each school/PSR class/home school program, and four \$1,000 scholarships will be announced at the Awards Assembly at the Cardinal Rigali Center on April 24, 2013.

This year's topic sentence, to which students will respond, focuses on the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Roe v. Wade Supreme Court decision—January 22, 2013 marks the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Supreme Court decision which legalized abortion in our country. How has 40 years of abortion impacted our culture? How do you plan to help end abortion?
